Background

The Global Youth Forum is the first global thematic meeting being convened as part of the assessment of the implementation of the Programme of Action of the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) and its follow up beyond 2014. It aims at addressing issues related to young people staying healthy; getting comprehensive education; transiting to decent work; to sexuality, families and rights; and leadership and meaningful youth participation and to identify concrete recommendations for achieving the rights and development goals of the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) beyond 2014 and for a credible United Nations development agenda beyond 2015. Through the innovative use of web and mobile technologies, before and after Bali, the Forum also aims at creating national and global platforms for sustained conversation on youth issues that enable young people to influence policy at country, regional and global levels. The concept of the conference is dedicated to facilitating a more broad-based dialogue on youth, thus catalyzing a sustainable youth movement and encouraging innovation on youth issues.

The Global Youth Forum is an innovative departure from the more traditional United Nations conferences. In preparation for the thematic discussions in the forum, five experts -one representing each key area-have prepared reports on their respective topics. The experts will make presentations on their papers at the conference, setting the stage for a more proactive dialogue among Forum attendees and stakeholders worldwide. In order to ensure consistency with the perspectives of young people, the draft papers were reviewed by young people, who also framed the issues for the discussions in the World Café and in other targeted interactions. The leadership of young people in all aspects of the Global Youth Forum constitutes the basis for their ownership of the development agenda.

The conference lays a heavy focus on communication via social networks, capitalizing on new and still-evolving technologies. This takes advantage of the strong preferences of the young people everywhere for those media and should encourage a more meaningful long-term conversation among both in-person and virtual participants, and more effectively involve other young people in the process, particularly those hailing from traditionally underrepresented demographics. Private sector leaders and other knowledgeable parties have been instrumental in contributing to harness the power of technology in an engaging manner, as well as to establish methods of reaching young people who remain isolated from social networking technologies. Ultimately, the Forum's focus on social networking revolves not around how adults can better communicate with young people; it explores how young people can best connect with one another.

Participants

The event is expected to be attended by approximately 1000 participants, representing government officials, youth, international organizations, private sector partners, non-governmental organizations, foundations and other civil society institutions, the United Nations System and media from all United Nations Member States.

Accommodation

Accommodation arrangements for all participants have been made by the Global Youth Forum Secretariat. Information in regard to participants' accommodation, including the room rates, will be sent directly to participants by email, after they register.

Internet access facilities at the hotels or resort will be provided free according to hotel or resort arrangements.

Dress Code

Dress code during the event is smart casual. However, the Secretariat will provide batik shirts to all participants on the first day of the event.

Local Transportation

The Secretariat shall provide free pick-up service for one-way trips from the airport to the hotel and from the hotel to event venue. Bus transfer will be timed according to the event schedule.

Alternatively, participants can use the taxi service available at the airport or hotels for approximately US\$ 16 / IDR 150.000 (sedan, maximum 3 persons). Delegates should only use Bluebird taxis.

Air Ticket Arrangement

The Secretariat recommends participants have a fixed flight schedule. Any charges or arrangements that arise due to changes on flight arrangements are the responsibility of participants.

Kindly note that an airport tax charge of **Rp. 150,000** (about US\$ 15~16) applies upon international destination departure.

Hospitality Desk

The Secretariat will maintain a hospitality desk in the Ngurah Rai International Airport, Denpasar, Bali, from 1-8 December, 2012. At Jakarta International Airport, immigration officers will assist arriving delegates and provide them with guidance.

Hospitality desks also will be set up for registration of participants at the selected resort or hotels.

Meeting Arrangements

a. Conference Registration

Registration of participants will be conducted at hospitality desks located at the resorts or hotels where participants would be staying during the event based on arrangements made by the Global Youth Forum Secretariat.

Registration will take place on 1, 2 and 3 December, 2012 from 09.00 to 17.30 hrs. All VIPs, Government representatives, speakers, experts (facilitators, moderators, and rapporteurs), youth and NGO delegates, Steering Committee members, private sector, media, United Nations staff, and Secretariat are advised to register their names upon their arrival to obtain their different color scheme badges and participant information packs.

Badges must be worn at all times in a visible location, and will be required for entry into venues that are accessible to all participants.

b. Working Language

The working language of the conference will be English, and all documentations will be in English, except the final declaration which will have provisional language versions. However, there will be simultaneous interpretation in all the official languages of the United Nations in the conference plenary. Support in different languages will be provided in the World Café sessions.

c. Accessibility

Special arrangements will be made to ensure accessibility for persons with disabilities. Participants with disabilities are kindly requested to inform the Secretariat of their requirements.

d. Facilities and Equipment

Internet Access – Free Wi-Fi access will be available at all locations in the event venue.

Booths for Audio Interpretation – There will be simultaneous interpretations during the plenary in English, Arabic, Spanish, French, Chinese, Russian and Bahasa Indonesia. Booths for audio and interpretation facilities will be available at the plenary conference room. Head phones will be provided.

Internet Café – Computers (PC) with internet access will be available at internet cafés located in the venue site, and will be operational beginning on 4 December, 2012 at 10 am.

Media Center – The Media Center will be located at the venue site, and will be operational starting on 4 December 2012 at 10 am. Limited number of computers with internet access will be available at the media center, operational beginning on 4 December 2012 at 10 am.

Meals

Complimentary daily breakfast for participants will be provided by hotels or resorts where participants will be staying. Lunch, two coffee breaks, and two evening meals (on 4 and 6 December) will be provided. Participants with special dietary restrictions are kindly requested to inform the Secretariat of their requirements.

Laundry

Laundry service is available in hotels for an additional charge that shall be borne as a personal expense.

Credit Cards / ATM Cards

The use of credit card is widespread in hotels, restaurants and shops in town. Foreign ATM cards with the Visa, Cirrus, Maestro, or Plus symbols can be used to withdraw Indonesian Rupiah from most ATMs.

Currency and Banking

The national currency of Indonesia is the Indonesian Rupiah. US\$ 1 (one) is equivalent to approximately Rp. 9,500 (nine thousand and five hundred rupiah). Banking hours are Monday to Friday from 10 AM to 3 PM. Most banks handle travelers' cheques and change foreign currencies. Passports are required when cashing travelers' cheques. A nominal commission may be charged.

Most shopping malls and money changers in Bali only accept US dollar banknotes printed very recently, and in excellent, uncirculated physical condition.

Communication

Most GSM cellular phones will work with local GSM SIM cards. Vendors that sell GSM SIM cards as well as recharge credits (*pulsa*) for local GSM numbers are located throughout Bali. You can find GSM vendors at the Airport (International Terminal) that provide local GSM SIM cards and registration services for your cellular phone for approximately US\$ 6, or IDR 50.000.

Time Zone

Local time in Bali is GMT +8 hours.

Electricity and Electrical Plug Detail

220-240 V, 50 Hz. European-style with 2 (two) round plugs.

Drinking Water

Tap water is not safe to drink. Participants are advised to drink bottled or sterilized water.

First Aid and Medical Assistance

It is suggested that participants secure travel medical insurance. They should also bring their own personal medicaments, as needed. However, the Secretariat will provide medical assistance in terms of first aid facilities at the venue and ambulance services. There are various international clinics and hospitals located within convenient distance from the event venue. Serious medical costs shall be borne at personal expense.

Insurance

The Secretariat **shall not** be responsible for personal accidents or damage to the private property of delegates. It is highly advisable for delegates to make their own arrangements with respect to personal insurance.

Passport and Visa Requirements

1. Any foreigners wishing to enter Indonesia are required to have passport valid for at least **6 (six) months** from the date of arrival along with proof (ticket) of onward or return passage and have to obtain a 30 day non-extendable visa¹
2. Participants are kindly advised to check the visa regulations at the nearest Indonesian Embassy/Consulate General/Consulate².
3. Participants who have received official invitation letter for attending the event are requested to contact the Indonesian Embassy/Consulate in their country well before the event to obtain visa and verify any immigration documents necessary to visit Indonesia.

Participants (except journalists) who come from countries with no Embassies or consulates of Indonesia are requested to contact the Global Youth Forum Secretariat for further information on how to obtain a visa and verify any immigration documents necessary to visit Indonesia. Please contact:

4. The Government of Indonesia has specific rules for international journalists wishing to enter Indonesia. Journalists who are not based in Indonesia should contact the Indonesian Embassy located in their respective country or the nearest Indonesian Embassy at least **1 (one) month** in advance. (A list of Indonesian Embassy addresses is attached. You may also visit the website of Indonesian Ministry of Foreign Affairs for information on the nearest Indonesian mission in your

Health and Vaccination

Evidence of valid yellow fever vaccinations are required of travelers coming from infected areas.

Customs Regulations

The carriage of narcotic drugs, arms, and ammunition into the territory of the Republic of Indonesia is strictly prohibited. Offenders are subject to strict and severe punishment.

Delegates may bring with them duty-free goods with a declared value not exceeding US\$ 250 per person. Travelers bringing in goods for temporary importation will be required to leave a deposit at the port of entry; the refund of deposit will be made when the goods are taken out of the country.

No restriction is imposed as to the maximum amount of foreign currency allowed to be brought in. However, foreign currency worth more than Rp. 100 million must be declared to the custom authorities upon arrival at the first port of entry.

Bali



The island of Bali has an area of only 5,632 square kilometers (2,175 square miles) and measures just 55 miles (90 kilometers) along the north-south axis and less than about 90 miles (140 kilometers) from east to west. Because of this, it is easy to explore the island on day tours. You can go wherever you want on the island and return to your hotel or villa in the evening.



Located only two kilometres east of Java, Bali's climate, flora, and fauna are quite similar to its much larger neighbour. The island is famous for its beautiful landscape. A chain of six volcanoes, between 1,350 meters and 3,014 meters high, stretches from west to east. There are lush tropical forests, pristine crater lakes, fast flowing rivers and deep ravines, picturesque rice terraces, and fertile vegetable and fruit gardens. The beaches in the South consist of white sand, beaches in other parts of the island are covered with grey or black volcanic sand.



In spite of many changes caused by the rapid development of Bali's economy, local and international tourism, and communications (television, fax, pagers, GSM hand phones, Internet), the influx of people from other Indonesian islands, and the strong influence of the government and "big business" in Jakarta, the island of Bali in Indonesia is, year after year, voted by the readers of all major travel magazines the **most enchanting travel and holiday destination in the whole world.**



Bali's natural attractions include miles of sandy beaches (many are well-known amongst surfers), picturesque rice terraces, towering active volcanoes over 3,000 meters (10,000 ft.) high, fast flowing rivers, deep ravines, pristine crater lakes, sacred caves, and lush tropical forests full of exotic wildlife. The island's rich cultural heritage is visible everywhere - in over 20,000 temples and palaces, in many colourful festivals and ceremonies (including tooth filings and cremations), in drama, music, and dance.



The climate of Bali is tropical, with high temperatures throughout the year. Throughout the year, daytime temperatures in Bali rarely stray from minimum 27°C / 77°F to maximum 30°C / 86°F. However, during December, the climate is entering the **rainy season**; therefore, comfortable warm-weather clothes and an umbrella are probably required. Bali's wide variety of attractions, the physical beauty of the island, and the year-round pleasant climate make Bali a place regarded by many visitors as the "Ultimate Island." Visa on Arrival can be obtained directly when the delegates arrive at certain airports and seaports in Indonesia, regardless of the purpose of the visit (Business, Tourist, Social-Cultural). Visa on Arrival is neither a work visa nor a visit visa. Therefore, it cannot be extended or converted into another immigration permit. The maximum stay permitted is thirty (30) days and could be extended (one time) for a maximum thirty (30) days.

The general requirements for visa on arrival are:

- The applicant's passport must be valid for at least 6 (six) months from the date of entry
- Round-trip airplane ticket.
- Fees are:
 - a) up to 7 (seven) days: US\$ 10
 - b) up to 30 (thirty) days: US\$ 25
