Instagram is an online photo-sharing, video-sharing and social networking service that enables its users to take pictures and videos, apply digital filters to them, and share them on a variety of social networking services, such as Facebook, Twitter, Tumblr & Flickr. A distinctive feature is that it confines photos to a square shape, similar to Polaroid images, in contrast to the 16:9 aspect ratio now typically used by mobile device cameras. You are also able to record and share short videos lasting for up to 15 seconds. So don't forget to experiment with videos too!

Live Tweeting - What is it?

This basically means tweeting in real time or as the conference/event unfolds

A few important things to remember:

- 1. Use the event hashtag.
- 2. Tag speakers and organizations in your tweets. This will not only make your presence known to those participating, but will also increase your chances of being retweeted.
- 3. Try your best to engage with other live-tweeters. Use the hashtag to search for others who are tweeting in other sessions and start a conversation, to increase chances of being retweeted.
- 5. Don't forget to take pictures! According to Social News Daily, tweets with pictures are 94 percent more likely to be retweeted
- 6. Each piece of information you tweet should be able to survive on its own, independent of the tweets that preceded or followed it. If and when you are retweeted, your new audience viewing that tweet may not have seen your other tweets, so it's important that it makes sense to them.
- 7. Watch the other conference hash tags. In addition to tweeting out the session you're attending, look out for the tweets coming out of other sessions and roundtables.
- 8. TweetChat is a great tool for live tweeting. It allows you to track just the tweets coming from one hash tag, and will automatically add the tag to the end of every tweet you post from the tool.

A few guidelines...

Social Media blurs the boundaries between personal and work life. When personal opinions are expressed through social media that refer to an external organization, it raises certain ethical challenges. We encourage you to express your opinions, however, we hope that you do consider the context in which they are expressed and do not aim to undermine the conference or organizations involved.

Do's

- Always use #WCY2014 hashtag
- Always tag @WCY_2014 in posts
- Always link to www.wcy2014.com website for relevant content
- Always check with an official before expressing highly sensitive content that could harm people
- Always be mindful of the hashtags used
- Be respectful of others' opinions even if you don't agree with them since many of them will probably have different values and opinions than you.
- Be mindful of the online footprint you're creating.
- Be a 'giver' and not only a 'taker'. Sharing resources and passing on information that you know would be of interest people is a must.

- Know your audience. Your social media strategy is only good if your audience response and relates to the content you share.
- Do tailor your content to the right network. Each social media channel is different and thus different types of content work best. It's all about context.
- Give credits to original author of the content, when re-posting material shared by others
- Respect the privacy of other users/delegates.

Don'ts

- Don't bombard posts with too many hashtags. Use the most relevant ones
- Don't harass or bully persons via social media
- Don't be afraid of haters. Haters are going to be out there and haters gonna hate, there is nothing you can do about it.
- Don't force your thoughts or beliefs onto others in a disrespectful manner after all, your opinion is just that yours.
